


# February 2024 MEMBERSHIP NEWSLETTER

## Spotlight On: Marilyn Johnson FOL Volunteer Focuses on Service, Dedication and Belief

Marilyn Johnson is the membership director of the Friends of the Library, Pollock Pines branch. She has been on the FOL board of directors for a dozen years and a member before that after moving to her dream home in Pollock Pines about 25 years ago. By 2012, Pollock Pines FOL was inactive and that year Marilyn was part of a group of people from the Dogwood Garden Club who revitalized FOL. She served as president, member-

ship director, and treasurer. To put it mildly, Marilyn believes in the value and benefits of volunteer service.

Deservedly, Marilyn takes pride in the work of the FOL. She spearheaded the organization and operation of five book kiosks placed at the campsites at Jenkinson Lake in the Sly Park Recreation Area. Since working with the Explorer Scouts to install the book kiosks, she has attended to their upkeep and restocking. As a member, before becoming President, she recalls participating in many fundraisers to purchase the first personal computer installed at the library.



She recalls the multi-year effort to get the library open on Saturdays and FOL's purchase of portable bookshelves and the new modern front desk.

Marilyn had a full career as a banker in the Bay Area and upon moving to Pollock Pines she took a job at El Dorado Savings Bank, becoming the branch manager before retiring. Like others, she moved here for the trees, mountains and tranquility. Marilyn knows well that the spirit of the Pollock Pines Library

stems from people who freely contribute their time and money. The land on which the library sits was donated; the materials for the building were donated; and the service of constructing the building was donated. This fits well with Marilyn, as she learned from her mother that people should give back to their community; that when they can, they should not always be a taker, but a giver as well. That spirit is alive today, as the Pollock Pines branch has a county-wide reputation of being "small, but mighty." Marilyn's service contributed greatly to this reputation.
